## BIRD TABLES



### Timber Framed Barn

We moved a barn to form our sitting room and this is a reduced version of that. It is made of English oak and tanalised pine, with a lead covered half hipped roof. 18" high 16 1/2" x 19 3/4" .

### Venetian Villa

There is a British pavilion in the public gardens near the Arsenal in Venice - this is loosely based on that building. 15.5" high and 24" x 17.5" overall in the base.

### Moorish Pagoda

This was the first of the garden follies. These are primarily to bring the excitement of a folly to the smaller garden. That is not to say that they would not look good in a large garden if used as the focus of a view and designed to the same scale. 33" high and 18" square.

### Market Cross

Many towns in England have market crosses. This one is influenced by the one at Salisbury, although I have left out some masonry which complicated the model too much. 29" high x 21.5" across the hexagonal base.

### Dunster Yarn Market

The Marketplace in the town of Dunster in Somerset is an octagonal building and this is quite a true representation. It is made of oak with a complicated lead covered roof. 27" high and 27" across the longest octagonal axis.

### Rotunda

Any landscape garden worth its salt has a rotunda. There are two very fine ones at Stowe. This one is rather like the Temple of Vesta at Tivoli near Rome with simple curved bars above a circular colonnade. 24" high and 19" in diameter.

### Greek Temple

I was influenced by the beautiful temples at Paestum in central Italy, but this could be the Parthenon or any other Greek temple, for that matter. 16 1/2" high and 16" x 20" in the base.

### Bandstand

This folly is the only one to rely mainly on metal. The roof has an attractive curve in copper and the trellis rails give a lightness to it. There are many bandstands like this - a good example is in the south east corner of Hyde Park. 29" high by 27" across the broad hexagonal roof.

### Paris Facade

When the French voted "Non" in their EU referendum, the BBC reporter was standing in front of this facade. Repeating the facade into a four sided building has created a rather Italianate villa. 16" high x 15" square
